

You will also need:

- (1) piece of batting 65" x 78" (165cm x 198cm)
- Basic sewing supplies and tools

Cutting Instructions: WOF/LOF = Width of Fabric/Length of Fabric

Emily Belle – Ivory (A), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 4 ½" squares.
- (3) 2 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 2 ⅞" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips and (8) 2 ½" x 4" strips.
- (10) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (148) 2 ½" squares.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2 ½" x 12 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 ½" x 3" strips, (2) 2" x 2 ½" strips, (2) 1 ½" x 2 ½" strips and (2) 1" x 2 ½" strips.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 64 ½" strips.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 55 ½" strips.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 51 ½" strips.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 42 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x 38 ½" WOF strips.
- (7) 1 ¼" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (208) 1 ¼" squares.
- (1) 1" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 1" x 4 ½" strips.

Fruit Twist – Green (B), cut

- (1) 2 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2 ⅞" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (13) 2 ⅜" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (208) 2 ⅜" squares.
- (1) 1" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 1" x 2 ½" strips.

Flowering Blossom – Orange (C), cut

- (1) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares and (12) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Wiltshire Shadow – Marmalade (D), cut

- (1) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares and (12) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Wiltshire Shadow – Rose Pink (E), cut

- (1) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares.
- (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Polka Fruit – Pink (F), cut,

- (1) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares and (12) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Strawberry Picking – Pink (G)

- (1) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (10) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares.
- (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Flowering Blossom – Yellow (H), cut

- (1) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares and (12) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Wiltshire Shadow – Lemon (I), cut

- (1) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares and (12) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Wiltshire Shadow – Candy Pink (J), cut

- (1) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares.
- (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Wiltshire Shadow – Watermelon (K), cut

- (1) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares.
- (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
- (7) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

Flowering Blossom – Pink (L), cut

- (1) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares.
- (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Wiltshire Shadow – Leaf (M), cut

- (7) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (104) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
- (3) 1" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1" x 59 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (3) 1" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1" x 47 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Strawberry Picking – Blue (N), cut

- (4) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 68 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (3) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 57 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Fruit Twist – Green (Back), cut

- (2) 65" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 65" x 78" for the backing.

Sewing Instructions:

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " (0.64cm) seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise indicated. Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Place (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square on the left side of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance (Fig. 2).

2. Place another $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square on the right side of the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 4).

3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (16) Unit 1 strips total.





4. Sew together (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square, (1) Unit 1 strip and (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip, in that order from left to right, to make (1) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 2 rectangle (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (8) Unit 2 rectangles total.



5. Sew together (1) Unit 1 strip, (1) 1 " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip and (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 " Fabric A strip, in that order from left to right, to make (1) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 3 strip (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (8) Unit 3 strips total.

6. Place (1) $2\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric C square on top of (1) $2\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric A square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 7). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 7). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 8) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (2) Unit 4 squares (Fig. 9). Repeat to make an additional (3) Unit 4 squares.



7. Repeat Step 6 and refer to Figures 10-22 for fabric identification and placement to make the designated number of unit squares for Unit 5 through Unit 17.













8. Sew together (1) Unit 4 square, (1) 2 ½" Fabric D square, (1) 2 ½" Fabric C square and (1) Unit 5 square, in that order from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 23).

9. Repeat Step 8 and refer to Figure 23 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make Row Two, Row Three and Row Four.

10. Sew together the (4) pieced rows, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make (1) 8 ½" Unit 18 square (Fig. 23). Repeat to make a second Unit 18 square.



11. Repeat Steps 8-10 and refer to Figures 24-26 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (2) Unit 19 squares, (2) Unit 20 squares and (2) Unit 21 squares.







12. Sew (1) Unit 2 rectangle to the top of (1) Unit 18 square to make (1) 8 ½" x 12 ½" Block One rectangle (Fig. 27). Repeat to make a second Block One rectangle.



13. Repeat Step 12 and refer to Figures 28-30 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (2) Block Two rectangles, (2) Block Three rectangles and (2) Block Four rectangles.







14. Sew (1) Unit 8 square to the left side of (1) Unit 11 square. Starting from the top, trim the newly sewn strip to measure 2" x 4 1/2" to make (1) Unit 22 strip (Fig. 31). Repeat to make an additional (3) Unit 22 strips.





16. Sew (1) 1" x 4 1/2" Fabric A strip to the bottom of (1) Unit 22 strip to make (1) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" Unit 24 rectangle (Fig. 33). Repeat to make an additional (3) Unit 24 rectangles.



17. Sew (1) 1" x 4 1/2" Fabric A strip to the bottom of (1) Unit 23 strip to make (1) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" Unit 25 rectangle (Fig. 34). Repeat to make an additional (3) Unit 25 rectangles.

18. Sew together (1) Unit 11 square, (1) Unit 14 square, (1) Unit 15 square and (1) Unit 8 square, in that order from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 35).

19. Sew together (2) 2 1/2" Fabric G squares and (2) 2 1/2" Fabric J squares, alternating them from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 35).

20. Sew together (2) 2 1/2" Fabric J squares and (2) 2 1/2" Fabric G squares, alternating them from left to right, to make Row Three (Fig. 35).

21. Sew together (1) Unit 8 square, (1) 2 1/2" Fabric J square, (1) 2 1/2" Fabric G square and (1) Unit 11 square, in that order from left to right, to make Row Four (Fig. 35).

22. Sew (1) 2 1/2" Fabric A square to each end of (1) Unit 24 rectangle to make Row Five (Fig. 35).

23. Sew together the (5) pieced rows, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make (1) 8 1/2" x 10 1/2" Unit 26 rectangle (Fig. 35).



24. Repeat Steps 18-23 to make an additional (3) Unit 26 rectangles.

25. Repeat Steps 18-23 and refer to Figure 36 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (4) Unit 27 rectangles.



26. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to the top of (1) Unit 26 rectangle lengthwise to make (1) 8 ½" x 12 ½" Block Five rectangle (Fig. 37). Repeat to make an additional (3) Block Five rectangles.



27. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to the top of (1) Unit 27 rectangle lengthwise to make (1) 8 ½" x 12 ½" Block Six rectangle (Fig. 38). Repeat to make an additional (3) Block Six rectangles.



28. Sew together (1) Block One rectangle, (1) 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric A strip, (1) Block Five rectangle, (1) 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric A strip, (1) Block Two rectangle, (1) 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric A strip and (1) Block Six rectangle, in that order from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 39).

29. Repeat Step 28 and refer to Figure 39 for component identification, placement and orientation to make Row Two, Row Three and Row Four.

30. Sew together the (4) pieced Rows in numerical order and (3) 1 ½" x 38 ½" Fabric A strips, lengthwise and alternating them from top to bottom, to make the 38 ½" x 51 ½" Center Block (Fig. 39).



31. Place (1) 2 ⅜" Fabric B square on the top left corner of (1) 2 ½" Fabric M square, right sides together (Fig. 40). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 40). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 41).

32. Follow Figure 42 for the seam direction to add a 2 ⅜" Fabric B square to the lower right corner of the 2 ½" Fabric M square to make (1) Unit 28 square (Fig. 43).

33. Repeat Steps 31-32 to make an additional (103) Unit 28 squares.



34. Place (1) 1 ¼" Fabric A square on the top left corner of (1) 2 ½" Unit 28 square, right sides together (Fig. 44). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 44). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 45).

35. Follow Figure 46 for the seam direction to add a 1 ¼" Fabric A square to the lower right corner of the 2 ½" Unit 28 square to make (1) Unit 29 square (Fig. 47).

36. Repeat Steps 34-35 to make (104) Unit 29 squares total.



37. Sew together (14) Unit 29 squares and (13) 2 ½" Fabric A squares alternating them from top to bottom. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 2 ½" Fabric A strip to the bottom of the newly sewn strip to make (1) Inner Side Border (Fig. 48). Repeat to make a second Inner Side Border.



38. Sew together (12) 2 ½" Fabric A squares and (11) Unit 29 squares, alternating them from left to right, to make the Inner Top Border (Fig. 49). Repeat to make the Inner Bottom Border.



39. Sew together (15) Unit 29 squares and (14) 2 ½" Fabric A squares alternating them from top to bottom. Sew (1) 1" x 2 ½" Fabric A strip to the top of the newly sewn strip and (1) 2" x 2 ½" Fabric A strip to the bottom of the strip to make (1) Outer Side Border (Fig. 50). Repeat to make a second Outer Side Border.



40. Sew together (12) Unit 29 squares and (11) 2 ½" Fabric A squares alternating them from left to right. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 3" Fabric A strip to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Outer Top Border (Fig. 51). Repeat to make the Outer Bottom Border.



Quilt Top Assembly: Refer to the Quilt Layout while assembling.

41. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 51 ½" Fabric A strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric A strip to the top and bottom of the Center Block.
42. Sew (1) Inner Side Border to each side of the Center Block. Sew the Inner Top Border and Inner Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
43. Sew (1) 1" x 59 ½" Fabric M strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1" x 47 ½" Fabric M strip to the top and bottom of the Center Block.
44. Sew (1) Outer Side Border to each side of the Center Block. Sew the Outer Top Border and the Outer Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
45. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 64 ½" Fabric A strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 55 ½" Fabric A strip to the top and bottom of the Center Block.

46. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $68\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric N strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $57\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric N strip to the top and bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
47. Layer and quilt as desired.
48. Sew the (7) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF Fabric K strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
49. Bind as desired.
