#### Jewel Garden EPP Quilt Pattern

The geometric layout of this quilt design echoes the grandeur of a formal garden, while the use of symmetry within the jewel blocks showcases the precise arrangement of fussy cut roses and hedgerow flowers to create balance and harmony. The striking diamond pathway of rich garnet tones allows the blue topaz details to shine.

The pattern's sense of structure is enhanced by the double piping finish to the quilt, which complements and completes the symmetrical appearance.



#### Skill Level: Advanced Beginner / Intermediate

This pattern is suited for someone who has English paper piecing experience. This pattern requires an intermediate knowledge of quilting techniques and terminology. The quilt and block diagrams portrayed are virtual images. The layout and look of your project may differ when using actual fabric.


1.50m (60") x 108" wide backing fabric – COSMOS PARK Item Code: 0166W68100A

#### MAKING INSTRUCTIONS FOR ENGLISH PAPER PIECED QUILT FRONT


#### **Cutting Fabric** – refer to each of the Quilt Block Layout Charts for requirements.

You can cut your shapes from strips of fabric using your templates when fussy cutting is not required.

Fabric strips can be folded in half, so two shapes can be cut at a time. A rotating cutting mat would be an ideal tool for this and a 28mm rotary cutter.

For the best results, press fabric before cutting.


1" Hexagons – can be cut from  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strips of width of fabric. 15 hexagons can be cut from each strip.




1" Diamonds – can be cut from 1 %" (4cm) width of fabric. 22 diamonds can be cut from each strip.



1" Triangles can also be cut using the 1"diamond template.



1" Half Hexagons – can be cut from 1 1/2" (4cm) strips of width of fabric. 18 half hexagons can be cut from each strip.



#### **Fussy cutting**

You get much more accurate results if you use a template. Purchase acrylics or trace the provided template on quilters' plastic template: This provides a window to select the part of the fabric design you wish to fussy cut.

On the wrong side of the fabric, position the template as required and draw around the outer edges: this will be your cutting line.

Mark the inside points to enable you to place the paper piece accurately for fussy cutting. There are also guidelines marked to help with centreing designs.

The templates have a 3/8" seam allowance. I find this gives a bit more wiggle room when wrapping over your paper pieces.

Ensure you repeat the same process when fussy cutting each shape in a set as in layout instructions.



#### **Basting fabric around paper pieces**

Personally, I prefer the speed and accuracy from glue basting; however, traditional thread basting can be used if preferred.

Top Tip - wrap the fabric around your pieces in the same direction to ensure that the pieces will nest together and make it easier for you when sewing together and allow the pieces to lay flat.

I tend to work around the shapes anti clockwise as shown right.



#### **Assembly of EPP Blocks**

Once you have cut and basted the EPP shapes they are ready for stitching together, using a whip stitch.

Top Tip – Place your needle in at 90° and this will make sure minimum stitching shows on the right side.

If you are sewing a light and dark fabric together, I recommend matching your thread to the lighter fabric.

The quilt top comprises of 6 Jewel blocks joined with a diamond pathway.


Once you complete each block, press and remove all papers apart from outer round of Fabric 1 and press again.

This will make assembly of the blocks easier and lighter to work with and removed papers can be pressed and reused in other blocks.

# **Fussy Cutting layouts**

Fabric 4 – cut 8 x 1" diamonds

3 diamonds with deep red flower motif

3 diamonds with pink flower motif

2 diamonds with yellow flower motif



Fabric 5 – cut 8 x 1" diamonds




The centre of this block features eight tumbling blocks.

Stitch together as per layout, as shown below.

To assemble each block, firstly stitch pairs of Fabric 5 and 6 diamonds right sides together, matching the points as marked by the star.


Then add a Fabric 4 diamond to complete the tumbling block. Repeat for all eight blocks.







Next, add Fabric 3 shapes and complete the block with a final round of Fabric 1 hexagons.




Fabric 4 – cut 2 x 1" hexagons

with deep red flower motif




The centre of this block features jewel flowers created from six identical fussycut sections.

To assemble the jewel flower units, stitch together in two halves as shown below.



Next, add Fabric 3 shapes and complete the block with a final round of Fabric 1 hexagons.

## **Fussy Cutting layouts**

Fabric 6 – cut 6 x 2" diamonds




Fabric 4 – cut 6 x 2" diamonds



The centre of this block features a star flower within a hexagon block. Six identical diamonds have been fussy cut from Fabric 6.

To assemble the star flower, stitch together the diamonds in two halves as shown below.






Add outer diamonds from Fabric 4 to form a hexagon block.



Complete the jewel block by adding Fabrics 7 shapes, followed by Fabric 3 shapes.

I found it easier to assemble by adding in sections around the hexagon, as shown right:

Finally add Fabric 1 hexagons.

The centre of this block features eight tumbling blocks.

Stitch together as per layout, as shown right.





Next, add Fabric 3 shapes and complete the block with a final round of Fabric 1 hexagons.


# **Centre Jewel Flower Fabric / EPP requirements** Fabric 6 6 2" Classic Jewels **Fussy Cutting Layout** Cut 6 x 2" Jewels

The jewel flower is created from six identical fussycut sections.

To assemble the jewel flower units, stitch together in two halves as shown below.








Join Jewel blocks 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 around the centre jewel flower. Taking care to position Blocks 1 and 4 correctly as the tumbling blocks are directional.

Add Fabric 6 diamond and triangle shapes as shown in diagram below.



Remove any papers as required, leaving papers in the outer border of Fabric 2 pathway.


Starting with Row A, work around diamond pathway adding Fabric 1 hexagons.


Continue to work around the panel, row by row, removing papers as required.

Note when you get to Row D you add half hexagons.

These straighten the left- and right-hand sides of the quilt top.

The finished EPP quilt top will look like this;





#### **Quilt Assembly**

Remove all papers and press quilt top.


Stitch around outer edge about one eighth of an inch from the edge. This will prevent seams popping open if you send quilt top to be long arm quilted.

Prepare quilt sandwich, lay backing fabric face down, add wadding and then quilt top face up.

Baste with quilting safety pins or method of your choice.

Quilt as desired with machine and / or hand stitching.

Trim and square quilt.



#### Optional: add double piping cord detail to edges.

Cut 6 x  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " width of fabric strips from Fabric 2 and 6 x  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " width of fabric strips from Fabric 3.

You do not need to cut the fabric strips on the bias as they are being used as straight borders.

Join Fabric 2 strips in the same method as below for binding.


Prepare 4 x 52" length of 4mm cord folding Fabric 2 strip around cord.

Using a zipper foot, and a long basting stitch, stitch as close to the cord as possible.

Now attach fabric 2 piping cord to the right and left sides of the quilt top.

Using your zipper foot, stitch as close as possible to the cord by moving the needle position.

Repeat, adding cord to the top and bottom of the panel as shown below.



Now attach the second row of piping Fabric 3 to the right and left sides of the quilt top.

Using your zipper foot, stitch as close as possible to the cord by moving the needle position.

Repeat adding cord to the top and bottom of the panel.

By adding the cords in the same order, you will achieve a nice, mitered corner as shown right.



#### **Quilt Binding**


Make quilt binding from Fabric 2 with 6 x 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  width of fabric strips.

Join two strips of binding fabric **Right sides** together at 45° and stitch.

Join all strips as above to form continuous length of binding.

Press seams open and trim to ¼".

Fold and press strip in half lengthwise with **Wrong sides** together.



Attach binding to quilt, using your zipper foot, stitching as close as possible to the cord by moving the needle position.

Sew a ¼" seam, miter at corners.

Top tip - Audition the binding before you sew it to the quilt top to ensure no binding seams meet on a corner.

Hand stitch the binding to the back with slip stitch or ladder stitch as preferred.



Don't forget to add a quilt label to your heirloom quilt!
