
LIBERTY FABRIC London Bouquet Collection

The collection is traditionally screen printed onto Lasenby cotton, a base specifically developed for quilting and craft projects.

You will also need:

- (1) piece of batting 76" x 87" (193cm x 221cm)
- Basic sewing supplies and tools

Cutting Instructions: WOF/LOF = Width of Fabric/Length of Fabric

Heritage Park (A), cut:

• (4) 4 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (15) 4 ¹/₂" x 10 ¹/₂" strips.

Heritage Park (B), cut:

• (4) 4 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (15) 4 ¹/₂" x 10 ¹/₂" strips.

Palace Petals (C), cut:

• (8) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (60) 2" x 4 ³/₄" strips.

Regent Meadow (D), cut:

• (9) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (60) 2" x 5 1/2" strips.

Emily Belle Ivory (E), cut:

- (8) 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (120) 2 ¹/₂" squares.
- (15) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (300) 2" squares.
- (18) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (71) 1 ¹/₂" x 10 ¹/₂" strips.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 69 ½" strips.
- Cut (3) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ¹/₂" x 60 ¹/₂" strips.

Palace Petals (F), cut:

• (8) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (60) 2" x 4 ³/₄" strips.

Regent Meadow (G), cut:

• (9) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (60) 2" x 5 ½" strips.

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Thames Twinkle (H), cut:

• (2) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (42) 1 ¹/₂" squares.

Thames Twinkle (I), cut:

- (4) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ¹/₂" x 67 ¹/₂" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 58 ½" strips.
- (8) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

Charming City (J), cut:

- (2) 4 ¹/₂" x 71 ¹/₂" LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 4 ¹/₂" x 68 ¹/₂" WOF strips, piece as needed.

Palace Petals-C (Back), cut:

• (2) 87" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 76" x 87" for the backing.

Sewing Instructions:


Sew using a ¼" (0.64cm) seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise indicated. The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Place (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square on the top left corner of (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the small square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ "" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 2).


2. Follow Figure 3 for the seam direction to add a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ Fabric E square to each of the remaining corners of the 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ Fabric A strip to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 4).

3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (15) Unit 1 strips total.


4. Repeat Steps 1-2 and refer to Figure 5 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (15) Unit 2 strips.



5. Place (1) 2" Fabric E square on the right side of (1) 2" x 4 $\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (30) Unit 3 strips total.




6. Repeat Step 5 and refer to Figures 8-10 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (30) of each unit strip for Unit 4 through Unit 6.




7. Sew together (1) Unit 3 strip, (1) 2" Fabric E square and (1) Unit 4 strip, end to end and in that order from left to right, to make (1) 2" x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 7 strip (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (30) Unit 7 strips total.

8. Sew together (1) Unit 5 strip, (1) 2" Fabric E square and (1) Unit 6 strip, end to end and in that order from left to right, to make (1) 2" x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 8 strip (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (30) Unit 8 strips total.



9. Place (1) 2" Fabric E square on the right side of (1) 2" x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 13). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 13). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 9 strip (Fig. 14). Repeat to make (30) Unit 9 strips total.



10. Repeat Step 9 and refer to Figures 15-17 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (30) of each unit strip for Unit 10 through Unit 12.




11. Sew (1) Unit 9 strip to the left end of (1) Unit 10 strip to make (2) $2^{"} \times 10^{"}_{2"}$ Unit 13 strip (Fig. 18). Repeat to make (30) Unit 13 strips total.


12. Sew (1) Unit 11 strip to the left end of (1) Unit 12 strip to make (2) $2^{"} \times 10^{"}_{2"}$ Unit 14 strip (Fig. 19). Repeat to make (30) Unit 14 strips total.


13. Sew together (1) Unit 13 strip, (1) Unit 7 strip, (1) Unit 1 strip, (1) Unit 7 strip and (1) Unit 13 strip, lengthwise and in that order from left to right, to make (1) $10 \frac{1}{2}$ " Block One square (Fig. 20). Repeat to make (15) Block One squares total.



14. Sew together (1) Unit 14 strip, (1) Unit 8 strip, (1) Unit 2 strip, (1) Unit 8 strip and (1) Unit 14 strip, lengthwise and in that order from top to bottom, to make (1) $10 \frac{1}{2}$ " Block Two square (Fig. 21). Repeat to make (15) Block Two squares total.




15. Sew together (6) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H squares and (5) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strips, end to end and alternating them from left to right, to make (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 56 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Three strip (Fig. 22). Repeat to make (7) Block Three strips total.



16. Sew together (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, (1) Block One square, (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, (1) Block One square, (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, (1) Block One square, (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, (1) Block One square and (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, (1) Block One square and (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, (1) Block One (Fig. 23). Repeat to make Row Three and Row Five.

17. Sew together (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, (1) Block One square, (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, (1) Block Two square and (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, (1) Block Two square and (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, (1) Block Two square and (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, in that order from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 23). Repeat to make Row Four and Row Six.

18. Sew together the (6) pieced Rows, lengthwise and in numerical order from the top to bottom, to make the 56 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 67 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Center Block (Fig. 23).



Quilt Top Assembly: Refer to the Quilt Layout while assembling.

19. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 67 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 58 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to the top and bottom of the Center Block.

20. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 69 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 60 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to the top and bottom of the Center Block.

21. Sew (1) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 71 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 68 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to the top and bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

22. Layer and quilt as desired.

23. Sew the (8) $2\frac{1}{2}$ x WOF Fabric I strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

24. Bind as desired.
