Pillow Fabric Requirements:

Urban Check - Red/Teal (A)	⅓ yard (0.31m)	01667417A
Charming City - Red (B)	⅓ yard (0.31m)	01667421B
Palace Petals - Red/Purple (C)	¼ yard (0.23m)	01667422A
Regent Meadow - Purple/Multi (D)	½ yard (0.23m)	01667418B
Heritage Park - Teal (E)	½ yard (0.23m)	01667419C
Emily Belle Ivory (F)	½ yard (0.46m)	01666416A

You will also need:

- (1) 50 cm square pillow form
- Basic sewing supplies and tools

Pillow Cutting Instructions: WOF/LOF = Width of Fabric/Length of Fabric

Urban Check - Red/Teal (A), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (7) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

Charming City - Red (B), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (3) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (7) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

Palace Petals - Red/Purple (C), cut:

- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (7) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

Regent Meadow - Purple/Multi (D), cut:

• (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

Heritage Park - Teal (E), cut:

• (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (7) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips and (2) 2 ½" squares.


Emily Belle Ivory (F), cut:

- (1) 1 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (24) 1 1/2" squares.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips and (4) 1 ½" x 2 ½" strips.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 20 ½" strips.


Pillow Sewing Instructions:

Sew using a $\frac{1}{2}$ " (0.64cm) seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise indicated. The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.


- 1. Place (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square on the top left corner of (1) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the small square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 2).
- 2. Follow Figure 3 for the seam direction to add a 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square to each of the remaining corners of the 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip to make (1) Block One strip (Fig. 4).
- 3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (3) Block One strips total.
- 4. Repeat Steps 1-2 and refer to Figure 5 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (3) Block Two strips.




5. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to each side of (1) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip lengthwise to make (1) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Three strip (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (4) Block Three strips total.




6. Sew together (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric D strip, (1) 1 ½" x 2 ½" Fabric F strip, (1) 2 ½" Fabric E square, (1) 1 ½" x 2 ½" Fabric F strip, (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric D strip, (1) 1 ½" x 2 ½" Fabric F strip, (1) 2 ½" Fabric E square, (1) 1 ½" x 2 ½" Fabric F strip and (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric D strip end to end and in that order from left to right. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 20 ½" Fabric F strip lengthwise to the top and bottom of the newly sewn strip to make (1) 20 ½" x 4 ½" Block Four strip (Fig. 7).



- 7. Sew together (1) Block One strip, (1) Block Three strip, (1) Block Two strip, (1) Block Three strip and (1) Block One strip, lengthwise and in that order from left to right to make the top row. Sew together (1) Block Two strip, (1) Block Three strip, (1) Block One strip, (1) Block Three strip and (1) Block Two strip, lengthwise and in that order from left to right, to make the bottom row (Fig. 8).
- 8. Sew together the top row, the Block Four strip and the bottom row, lengthwise and in that order from top to bottom, to make the 20 ½" x 20 ½" Pillow Front (Fig. 8).



- 9. Sew together (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric A strip, (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric D strip, (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric C strip, (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric B strip and (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric E strip, end to end and in that order from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 9).
- 10. Repeat Step 9 and refer to Figure 9 for fabric identification and placement to make Row Two through Row Seven.
- 11. Sew together the (7) pieced Rows in numerical order and (6) 1 ½" x 20 ½" Fabric F strips, lengthwise and alternating them from top to bottom, to make the 20 ½" x 20 ½" Pillow Back (Fig. 9).



Pillow Assembly:

12. Place the Pillow Front and Pillow Back right sides together aligning the raw edges. Pay attention to the orientation of each side. Sew the (2) sides together leaving a 7" - 8" opening along the bottom edge. Turn the sewn unit right side out. Insert the pillow form into the sewn unit. Make sure to push the form into each corner of the sewn unit. Hand stitch the opening closed to complete the pillow.
