

# Garden Party Bunting

## MATERIALS:

Makes 2 yds of 8 pennant bunting

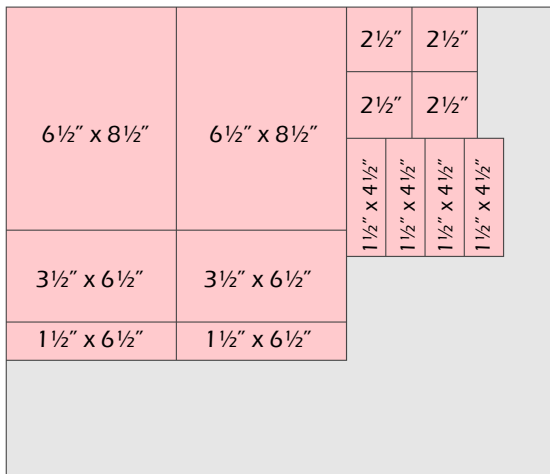
12 minimum 3" x 12" scraps of various *Palace Garden* prints for the crowns  
4 Fat Quarters of *Wiltshire Shadow* in sage, denim, peony and primrose for the pennants  
2 2" x WOF strips for the tape  
 1" bias tape maker

Please read through the pattern before you begin, assuming a ¼" seam allowance and a fabric width (WOF) of 42". Pattern Corrections can be found on my website [www.cakestandquilts.com](http://www.cakestandquilts.com) along with helpful tutorials on my blog.

## CUTTING:

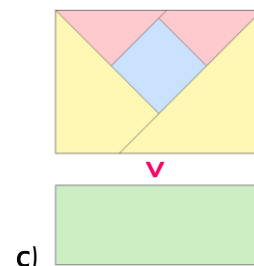
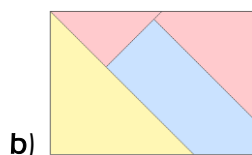
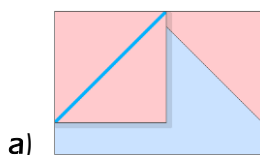
You will cut pieces for 2 pennants from each fabric.

1. Choose 4 print scraps for the crown centres and cut 2 3" x 4½" pieces from each.
2. Choose 4 print scraps for the sides of the crowns and cut 4 3" squares from each.
3. Choose 4 print scraps for the crown bands and cut 2 2" x 4½" pieces from each.
4. From each of the background Fat Quarters, cut as shown: -



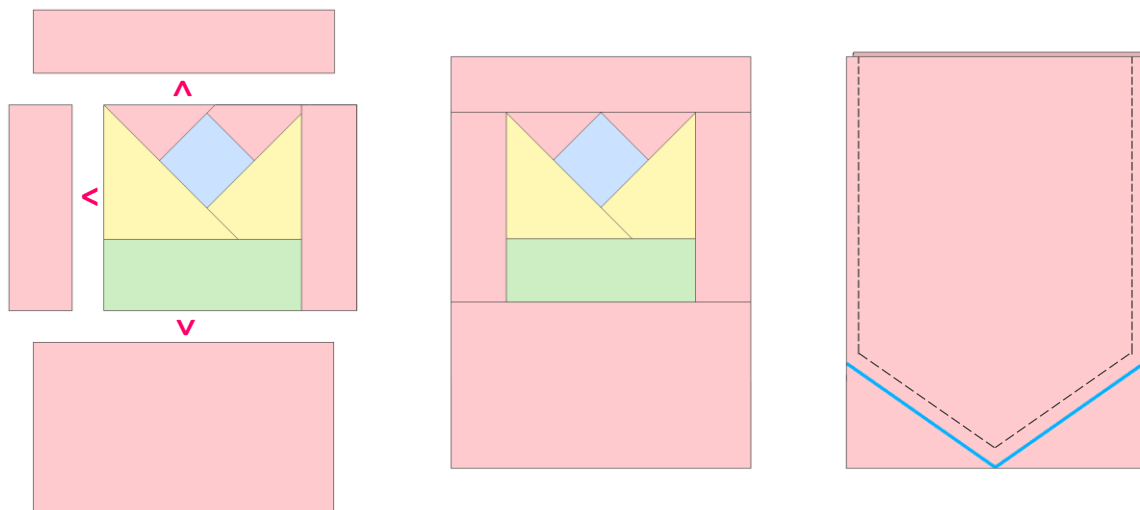
## PIECING THE FRONT OF THE PENNANT:

5. To create the top of the crown, snowball both top corners of a 3" x 4½" centre piece with 2½" background squares (a).



6. Next, snowball both bottom corners with 3" side squares (b), then join the 2" x 4½" band piece to the bottom, pressing as directed (>) (c).

7. Join a 1½" x 4½" background piece to each side, a 1½" x 6½" background piece to the top and a 3½" x 6½" background piece to the bottom, pressing away from the crown.



8. Layer a 6½" x 8½" on top of the pennant front, right sides together and pin. To shape the bottom, mark the centre and points 2" along each side and join them with a line.

Stitch the front and back of the pennant together, with a ¼" seam – stitching ¼" away from the marked line too – **but leaving the top open**.

9. Clip the corners before turning right sides out, using a crochet needle (or something similar) to gently push out the corners, and press lightly.

## MAKE 8

### MAKING THE BUNTING:

10. To make the bias tape, first trim the selvages from the 2" x WOF pieces and join them, with a diagonal seam, pressing the seam open. Make the tape with a 1" bias tape maker, following the manufacturer's instructions, then press in half along its length, enclosing the raw edges.

11. Arrange the pennant along the tape, enclosing the top edge and pin or glue baste in place - I left a gap of 2" between each pennant - then topstitch the tape closed to secure the pennants, turning a small hem at both ends of the tape.
