- (1) piece of batting 70" x 80" (178cm x 203cm)
- Basic sewing supplies and tools

Cutting Instructions: WOF/LOF = Width of Fabric/Length of Fabric

August Meadow Magnolia (A), cut:

- (3) 4 ¹/₈" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (30) 4 ¹/₈" squares.
- (3) 1 ⁷/₈" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (60) 1 ⁷/₈" squares.
- (3) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (30) 1 ¹/₂" x 3 ¹/₂" strips.
- (10) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (90) 1 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (30) 1 ¹/₂" squares.

York Fern Wisteria Purple (B), cut:

- (2) 4 ¹/₈" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) 4 ¹/₈" squares.
- (2) 1 ⁷/₈" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (36) 1 ⁷/₈" squares.

Wiltshire Shadow Lavender (C), cut:

- (2) 4 ¹/₈" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 4 ¹/₈" squares.
- (2) 1 ⁷/₈" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 ⁷/₈" squares.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 60 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 52 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

Mayflower Meadow - Purple (D), cut:

• (2) 4 ⁷/₈" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (9) 4 ⁷/₈" squares. Cut each square across (1) diagonal to make (18) 4 ⁷/₈" triangles.

Haberdashery Floral - Purple (E), cut:

• (2) 4 ⁷/₈" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (9) 4 ⁷/₈" squares. Cut each square across (1) diagonal to make (18) 4 ⁷/₈" triangles.

Mayflower Meadow - Coral (F), cut:

• (1) 4 ⁷/₈" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 ⁷/₈" squares. Cut each square across (1) diagonal to make (12) 4 ⁷/₈" triangles.

Haberdashery Floral - Coral (G), cut:

• (1) 4 ⁷/₈" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 ⁷/₈" squares. Cut each square across (1) diagonal to make (12) 4 ⁷/₈" triangles.

Tudor Tumble - Purple (H), cut:

- (5) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) 1 ¹/₂" x 8 ¹/₂" strips.
- (5) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) 1 ¹/₂" x 10 ¹/₂" strips.

Tudor Tumble - Coral (I), cut:

- (3) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 ¹/₂" x 8 ¹/₂" strips.
- (3) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 ¹/₂" x 10 ¹/₂" strips.

Quilt Nouveau - Purple (J), cut:

• (3) 3 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (30) 3 ¹/₂" squares.

York Fern Duck Egg Blue (K), cut:

- (3) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (30) 1 ¹/₂" x 3 ¹/₂" strips.
- (10) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (90) 1 ¹/₂" x 4 ¹/₂" strips.
- (2) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (30) 1 ¹/₂" squares.

Rossellie Blooms - Purple/Multi (L), cut:

• (2) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (30) 1 ¹/₂" squares.

Patchwork Scarves - Pink/Multi (M), cut:

(4) 5 ¹/₂"x 62 ¹/₂"LOF strips.

Emily Blossom - Clay 108" (Back), cut:

• (1) 70" x 80" strip.

Sewing Instructions:


Sew using a ¼" (0.64cm) seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise indicated. Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Place (1) 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric B square on the top left corner of (1) 4 $\frac{1}{8}$ " Fabric A square, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 2).

2. Follow Figure 3 for the seam direction to add a 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric B square to the bottom right corner of the 4 $\frac{1}{8}$ " Fabric A square to make (1) 4 $\frac{1}{8}$ " Unit 1 square (Fig. 4).


3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (18) Unit 1 squares total.

4. Repeat Steps 1-2 and refer to Figures 5-7 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (18) Unit 2 squares, (12) Unit 3 squares and (12) Unit 4 squares.




5. Cut each Unit 1 square across the diagonal from the upper right corner to the lower left corner to make (36) Unit 5 triangles (Fig. 1).

6. Repeat Step 5 and refer to Figures 9-11 for unit identification and cut direction to make (36) Unit 6 squares, (24) Unit 7 squares and (24) Unit 8 squares.




7. Sew together (1) Unit 5 triangle and (1) Unit 6 triangle along short sides to make (1) Unit 9 triangle (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (36) Unit 9 triangles total.

8. Sew together (1) Unit 7 triangle and (1) Unit 8 triangle along short sides to make (1) Unit 10 triangle (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (24) Unit 10 triangles total.



9. Sew together (1) Unit 9 triangle and (1) 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric D triangle along their long sides to make (1) Unit 11 square (Fig. 14). Trim the unit to measure 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Repeat to make (18) Unit 11 squares total.

10. Repeat Step 9 and refer to Figures 15-17 for fabric and unit identification, placement and orientation to make (18) Unit 12 squares, (12) Unit 13 squares and (12) Unit 14 squares.



11. Sew (1) Unit 11 square to the left side of (1) Unit 12 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 12 square to the left side of (1) Unit 11 square to make the bottom row. Sew together the (2) rows lengthwise to make (1) 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 15 square (Fig. 18). Repeat to make (9) Unit 15 squares total.

12. Sew (1) Unit 13 square to the left side of (1) Unit 14 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 14 square to the left side of (1) Unit 13 square to make the bottom row. Sew together the (2) rows lengthwise to make (1) $8 \frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 16 square (Fig. 19). Repeat to make (6) Unit 16 squares total.


13. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to each side of (1) Unit 15 square. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to the top and bottom of the Unit 15 square to make (1) 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Block One square (Fig. 20). Repeat to make (9) Block One squares total.


14. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to each side of (1) Unit 16 square. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to the top and bottom of the Unit 16 square to make (1) 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Two square (Fig. 21). Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.


15. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K strip to the left side of (1) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J square. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K strip to the top of the newly sewn strip to make (1) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 17 square (Fig. 22). Repeat to make (30) Unit 17 squares total.


16. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ x $3 \frac{1}{2}$ Fabric A strip to the left side of (1) $3 \frac{1}{2}$ Fabric L square. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ x $4 \frac{1}{2}$ Fabric A strip to the top of the newly sewn strip to make (1) $4 \frac{1}{2}$ Unit 18 square (Fig. 23). Repeat to make (30) Unit 18 squares total.

17. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip to the right side of (1) Unit 17 square. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K square to the right end of (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip. Sew the newly sewn strip to the bottom of the Unit 17 square to make (1) $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 19 square (Fig. 24). Repeat to make (30) Unit 19 square total.










18. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K strip to the right side of (1) Unit 18 square. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square to the right end of (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K strip. Sew the newly sewn strip to the bottom of the Unit 18 square to make (1) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 20 square (Fig. 25). Repeat to make (30) Unit 20 square total.

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19. Sew (1) Unit 19 square to the left side of (1) Unit 20 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 20 square to the left side of (1) Unit 19 square to make the bottom row. Sew together the (2) rows lengthwise to make (1) $10 \frac{1}{2}$ " Block Three square (Fig. 26). Repeat to make (15) Block Three squares total.



20. Sew together (3) Block One squares and (2) Block Three squares, alternating them from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 27). Repeat to make Row Three and Row Five.

21. Sew together (3) Block Three squares and (2) Block Two squares, alternating them from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 27). Repeat to make Row Four and Row Six.

22. Sew together the (6) pieced Rows, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 60 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Center Block (Fig. 27).



Quilt Top Assembly: Refer to the Quilt Layout while assembling.

23. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 60 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 52 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and bottom of the Center Block.

24. Sew (1) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 62 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric M strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 62 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric M strip to the top and bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

25. Layer and quilt as desired.

26. Sew the (7) $2\frac{1}{2}$ x WOF Fabric C strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

27. Bind as desired.
