

Festive Magic Yo-Yo Wreath



Project Size: 12" diameter (31cm diameter)
Skill Level: Advanced Beginner

Fabric Requirements:

Holiday Sparkle-Raspberry (A)	Fat Quarter (0.23m)	0166MT7520A
Ribbon Strip-Cream (B)	Fat Quarter (0.23m)	01667521A
Jolly Countdown-Multi (C)	Fat Quarter (0.23m)	01667522A
Twinkling Lights-Tan (D)	Fat Quarter (0.23m)	01667523A
Festive Store-Multi (E)	Fat Quarter (0.23m)	01667524A
Wiltshire Shadow-Black Currant (F)	¼ yard (0.23m)	01666527A

You will also need:

- 12" (31cm) Diameter Wood Wreath Frame
- Basic hand & machine sewing supplies and tools
- Hot glue gun or fabric glue
- Ruler with 45 degree line

Cutting Instructions: WOF/LOF = Width of Fabric/Length of Fabric

Holiday Sparkle – Raspberry (A), cut:

- (15) 3 ¼" circles using the provided template.

Ribbon Stripe – Cream (B), cut:

- (15) 3 ¼" circles using the provided template.

Jolly Countdown – Multi (C), cut:

- (15) 3 ¼" circles using the provided template.

Twinkling Lights – Tan (D), cut:

- (15) 3 ¼" circles using the provided template.

Festive Store – Multi (E), cut:

- (15) 3 ¼" circles using the provided template.

Wiltshire Shadow – Black Currant (F), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x 36" WOF strip.

Yo-Yo Assembly Instructions:

1. Press each of the Fabric A through Fabric E circles before sewing.
2. Thread your needle using a double strand of thread and knot the end.
3. Select (1) Fabric A circle and starting anywhere along the edge, fold the raw edge toward the wrong side by about $\frac{1}{4}$ " (Fig. 1). Sew a running stitch around the entire circle, stitching through the folded edge. Stitches should be even and about $\frac{1}{8}$ - $\frac{1}{4}$ " long, keeping the fold consistent as you go
4. Once you've stitched all the way around the circle, gently pull the thread to gather the fabric into a circle.
5. Adjust the gathers around the circle so they're evenly spaced around the circle. Pull the threads snug and make a couple of small stitches to secure the gather. Tie off the threads and trim.
6. Flatten the yo-yo with your fingers. The finished yo-yo will measure roughly $1\frac{1}{2}$ " - $1\frac{3}{4}$ " depending on fabric thickness and gather tension.
7. Repeat with the remaining $3\frac{1}{4}$ " circles to make (75) yo-yo's total.

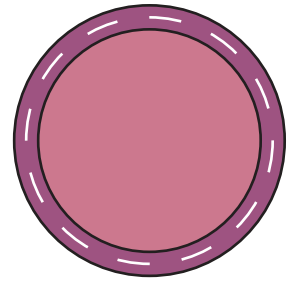

Bow Assembly Instructions:

8. Fold the $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x 36" Fabric F strip in half lengthwise, right sides together and press (Fig. 2).

9. Use a ruler with a 45-degree line to cut each end of the folded strip to have a 45 degree edge (Fig. 3).

10. Sew down each 45 degree sides and across the bottom edge of the folded strip, leaving a 3" opening for turning to make the bow strip (Fig. 4).

11. Turn the bow strip right side out through the opening. Fold in the raw edges at the opening and press.
12. Topstitch around the bow strip to finish the edges and to close the opening.
13. Tie the bow strip into a bow knot for the wreath.

Wreath Assembly Instructions:

14. Divide the assorted yo-yo's into four equal piles, making sure to evenly mix the different prints in each pile. You will use one pile for each quarter of the wreath.
15. Lay out the yo-yo's from one pile along the wreath frame, using (2) yo-yo's across the width of the wreath. Evenly space one quarter of the yo-yo's on one quarter of the wreath frame slightly overlapping the yo-yo's while working around the wreath.
16. Use either fabric glue, a hot glue gun and/or hand sew the yo-yo's to the wreath frame.
17. Repeat Steps 15 - 16 using (1) pile of yo-yo's for each remaining quarter of the wreath.
18. Position the bow on the top or bottom of the yo-yo's and sew or glue in place.
